III. Chair's Report

Dr. Debbie Sellnow-Richmond

- A. Membership numbers- Membership fluctuates based on who attends the conference. Has gone down since the pandemic as has general NCA membership.
- B. Finances: Did not use all the money this year. Was used to pay for the awards. Open the floor for ideas on how to use the remainder of money.
- C. Legislative Assembly report—update from Dr. Pyle and Dr. Sellnow-Richmond: Wednesday: Moved to electronic assembly, it worked quite well. Very little discussion on Wednesday. The budget for the last 10 years has been intentionally in a deficit. Has spent the endowment from \$10 to \$8 million. The NCA accountant says it looks good, and the finance committee is okay with it. Conflict of interest, hotel reimbursement, standing rules, leadership development, Dr. Tina Harris presented, introduction of new interest group death and dying division was approved, bylaws changes about recruitment. Everything was approved.

 Saturday: 20% response rate to NCA survey. Membership down due to affordability of location and if they were planning to attend the conference. Discussion on if conferences are cost-prohibitive. Division strategic plan how are we contributing to it as a Division? What is the most pressing to the organization? Report back: insufficient child care, not a lot of staff. Service is a work in progress and is not sufficient.

 - i. 16 slots provided to the division this year 15 excluding business meeting, decrease of 2 slots from last year
 - 1. Fluctuation due to membership number and increase divisions
 - ii. 50 reviewers
 - iii. 83 submissions total (up from last year)
 - 1. 48 papers accepted
 - 2. 19 papers declined
 - 3. 11 accepted paper sessions
 - 4. 1 declined paper session
 - iv. Cut the role of respondent this year, be able to increase the number of people per panel or give more time for presentations and Q&A

 - a. List of prior reviewers was shared and then they were contacted. Then a call was sent to the listsery.

 - i. Attempted to balance, but did not collect demographic information
 - ii. Something we can look into to get volunteer dei
 - 1. add optional questions to google survey

- C. Question about awards specifically: ask people early if they can commit to two-year roles in reviewing for awards. Allows us to have a standing group and can be a quicker turnaround
 - i. Strongly suggest pdf or electronic versions of all materials
 - ii. Could bolster the number of submissions we get
 - iii. Have more intentional gathering
 - 1. More networking and conversation opportunities
 - 2. Coffee with scholar, pairing graduate student with mentor and they meet up at some point during the conference
 - 3. Virtual meetings for mentoring
 - 4. Research cluster meetings small groups to work together
 - 5. Research escalator work in progress gets submitted and you work together on it
